Our competition provides a level of hockey in Master's, that is amongst the highest in Australia. We now have just under 500 players, in a competition with 28 teams. We are very lucky to have such a great standard of competition here in Sydney, let's keep it that way.

Our teams were well represented at State Championships this year. We entered 9 teams from Sydney covering all ages and divisions. We were successful in the 50/1's and 65/2's, congratulations to all these players. From these, we had 56 players selected for state representation, and a number of Australian selections, congratulations to all.

A huge thank you to our volunteer base. The team co-ordinators, delegates, umpires that show up every week, especially Craig Millar for his duties as Umpire Manager. A special thank you to Simon McCoy who took on the role of Competition Manager for 2019 under the watchful eye of Steve Reilly. There have been many positive comments about the way in which Simon has covered this position during the year. He is staying on in 2020, well done to both of you.

It was also a very pleasing result to see the number of cards given during the season was kept to a minimum. There were no red cards this season, and therefore, no judiciary required. Keep up the good work and attitude. Remember, no umpires, no game!

It is a credit to our board members, that SMHA is in such a strong, healthy position. As volunteers, many of us spend an incredible amount of time ensuring the competition runs as smoothly as possible and there are many after-hours meetings and emails that require attention.

I would like to reiterate from last year, that we have our own portal through Hockey NSW. This was a major step in keeping Sydney Masters a strong independent association that is affiliated with Hockey NSW. I would encourage you to use the portal in 2020 as your main registration point, especially if you are only playing Masters' mid-week. It is an uncomplicated process and it helps HNSW know actual playing numbers.

Please keep an ear to the ground of new players wishing to play mid-week masters. There is room especially in the Premier Division, we want to keep the standard as high as we can.

We do have some exciting news on our new software system to be introduced in 2020. James Fordham, our technical IT guru, will be showcasing how much easier this make the life of a Co-ordinator in 2020. Watch this space.

#### **2019 Australian Masters Championships**

At the 2019 Australian Men's Masters Championships played in Bunbury and Busselton, Western Australia in September / October, the NSW teams were successful.

Overall, NSW teams were outstanding in contesting 11 of the 14 Divisions final series of matches, winning four (runners up in 3) and were again one of the most successful Men's Masters Hockey State in Australia along with Western Australia.

The 55/1's, 65/1's and Over 75's were outstanding in winning their respective division. Successful also were the 60/2's who won their division. The 35's, 55/2's and 60/1's lost their finals to WA, Tasmania and WA respectively after going into these matches as favourites. The 40/1's, 45/1's, 45/2's and 50/1's were all beaten in their semi finals after performing well throughout the rounds – they finished 3<sup>rd</sup>, 3<sup>rd</sup> and 4<sup>th</sup> respectively. The only teams to miss the finals were the Over 40/2's, 50/2's and 70's.

Our congratulations to all NSW players (and especially all the players from Sydney) for their outstanding individual efforts in strongly contesting all divisions. The championship experience is one that will remain in the memories of all players for many years to come.

#### Note 1: Statement of Accounting Policies

This financial report is a special purpose financial report prepared in order to satisfy the financial reporting requirements of the Associations Incorporation Act New South Wales. The committee has determined that the association is not a reporting entity.

The financial report has been prepared on an accruals basis and is based on historic costs and does not take into account changing money values or, except where specifically stated, current valuations of non-current assets.

The following significant accounting policies, which are consistent with the previous period unless otherwise stated, have been adopted in the preparation of this financial report.

#### a) Income Tax

No provision for income tax has been raised as the entity is exempt from income tax under Section 50-45 of the Income Tax Assessment Act 1997.

#### b) Inventories

Inventories are measured at the lower of cost and net realisable value.

#### c) Property, Plant and Equipment (PPE)

Leasehold improvements and office equipment are carried at cost less, where applicable, any accumulated depreciation.

The depreciable amount of all PPE is depreciated over the useful lives of the assets to the association commencing from the time the asset is held ready for use.

Leasehold improvements are amortised over the shorter of either the unexpired period of the lease or the estimated useful lives of the improvements.

#### d) Impairment of Assets

At each reporting date, the entity reviews the carrying values of its tangible and intangible assets to determine whether there is any indication that those assets have been impaired. If such an indication exists, the recoverable amount of the asset, being the higher of the asset's fair value less costs to sell and value in use, is compared to the asset's carrying value. Any excess of the asset's carrying value over its recoverable amount is expensed to the income statement.

#### e) Employee Benefits

Provision is made for the association's liability for employee benefits arising from services rendered by employees to balance date. Employee benefits have been measured at the amounts expected to be paid when the liability is settled.

#### f) Provisions

Provisions are recognised when the association has a legal or constructive obligation, as a result of past events, for which it is probable that an outflow of economic benefits will result and that outflow can be reliably measured. Provisions are measured at the best estimate of the amounts required to settle the obligation at the end of the reporting period.

#### g) Cash and Cash Equivalents

Cash and cash equivalents include cash on hand, deposits held at-call with banks, other short-term highly liquid investments with original maturities of six months or less.

#### 1 Statement of Accounting Policies (continued)

#### h) Revenue and Other Income

Revenue is measured at the fair value of the consideration received or receivable after taking into account any trade discounts and volume rebates allowed. For this purpose, deferred consideration is not discounted to present values when recognising revenue.

Interest revenue is recognised using the effective interest rate method, which for floating rate financial assets is the rate inherent in the instrument. Dividend revenue is recognised when the right to receive a dividend has been established.

Grant and donation income is recognised when the entity obtains control over the funds, which is generally at the time of receipt.

All revenue is stated net of the amount of goods and services tax (GST).

#### i) Leases

Leases of PPE, where substantially all the risks and benefits incidental to the ownership of the asset, but not the legal ownership, are transferred to the association, are classified as finance leases.

Finance leases are capitalised by recording an asset and a liability at the lower of the amounts equal to the fair value of the leased property or the present value of the minimum lease payments. Including any guaranteed residual values. Lease payments are allocated between the reduction of the lease liability and the lease interest expense for that period.

Leased assets are depreciated on a straight-line basis over the shorter of their estimated useful lives or the lease term.

Lease payments for operating leases, where substantially all the risks and benefits remain with the lessor, are charged as expenses in the periods in which they are incurred.

#### j) Goods and Services Tax

Revenues, expenses and assets are recognised net of the amount of GST, except where the amount of GST incurred is not recoverable from the Australian Taxation Office (ATO). Receivables and payables are stated inclusive of the amount of GST receivable or payable. The net amount of GST recoverable from, or payable to, the ATO is included with other receivables or payables in the statement of financial position.

Cash flows are presented in the cash flow statement on a gross basis, except for the GST component of investing and financing activities, which are disclosed as operating cash flows.

#### k) Comparative Figures

When required by Accounting Standards, comparative figures have been adjusted to conform to changes in presentation for the current financial year.
