We now have the software running, programmed by Jimmy Fordham. You will see further refinements and new improved features coming into 2021. These will include a photo ID and ease of use, especially with mobile devices. It will be a requirement that all match cards are filled before the games.

Unfortunately, due to Covid, we only had time for one State Championship this year. I'm sure we will be very enthusiastic to get our Sydney Masters team's back in full flight next season.

Thank you to Simon McCoy for his efforts with this and his role as the Competition Manager. The board agreed to host the annual dinner night involving all team Co-Ordinator's, however, with Covid restrictions still in place, it has been deferred until the end of 2021.

A huge thank you to our volunteer base. The team Co-Ordinator's, delegates, umpires that show up every week, and of course, my fellow board members. As volunteers, many of us spend an incredible amount of time ensuring the competition runs as smoothly as possible and there are many after-hours meetings and emails that require attention. A special thank you to our Steve Reilly. Steve is standing down from the board this season. He has been an integral part of our day to day operations. His dedication over many years will be missed. Enjoy your 2021 season Steve.

I am nominating again as President for 2021. Many people have enquired about my health after a scare in September. ### **2020 SMHA Competition Report**

I sit to prepare the report on our 2020 season with some relief and many thanks to the hockey gods. Had I attempted this task a few months back, the report would simply have read:

"Season cancelled due to the COVID-19 Pandemic".

Indeed, as I look to other hockey jurisdictions, the seven words above have been used multiple times to describe what happened to competitions across Australia, as well as within regional NSW.

We have been fortunate here in Sydney to have our game rebooted in July, running without any COVID related hitches right through to the end of October. Congratulations for this not inconsiderable achievement needs to be shared by all our 638 members and each of the fifteen clubs. A special mention must also go to the many COVID-19 marshals who week in and week out ensured all surfaces were disinfected before and after each game, as well as reminding all of us of our responsibilities in the COVID new normal. From the outset we collectively and individually took responsibility to safely participate in a season impacted by the pandemic. We were rewarded for our good practice by a restarted competition consisting of 114 games plus a final's series. This with **ZERO** COVID-19 infections.

A remarkable (some might say extraordinary) achievement when you consider the re started season represents more than 130 hours where some 25 sweaty, puffing old blokes had the opportunity to come into close contact with each other, without any PPE except for mouth guard and shin pads! Looking back to the environment back in July, and recalling the conversations at the time, it was a very brave person who would have predicted the season would run its course through to October without incident.

So, in short, 2020 will be remembered as an unprecedented year, where despite considerable obstacle, our members were able to enjoy what ended up as a full season of hockey and the camaraderie it afforded. There were some remarkable achievements worth noting this year.

- In our four team Premier League Competition. By being awarded the premiership, UTS demonstrated the importance of not peaking too early in a tournament. Having finished fourth during the regular season, the importance of winning the last two games was not lost on UTS.
- Congratulations also to Macquarie University, who in their first year entering a team in our Sydney Cup competition finished third in the minor premiership with six wins from 12 games. We look forward to seeing the students back again in 2021 eager to build on their 2020 success.
- Congratulations also to our Sydney Representative teams who participated in the only NSW Championships held this year. The four teams we sent to contest the Over 65 and Over 50 competitions in Bathurst, bringing home gold medals in each of the A Divisions and silver medals in the B Divisions.
- In a year turned upside down by the pandemic, we were also able to deploy our new computer aided competition management system. Once all became familiar with the process, it represents a significant saving in time and effort on the part of our hard working team co-ordinators.

### SMHA Web portal update

The new (launched 2019) digital competition management platform was again deployed in 2020. Pre Covid-19 it performed without a hitch, as expected, however, post-Covid, we did face a number of challenges for the remainder of the season.

Specifically, we encountered issues due to:

- Team not able to field side post-Covid (round 4) and had to be removed from draw, ladder altered, and rounds 1 3 nullified.
- Players switching clubs
- Match cards not being completed, &/or closed out on game night

The actual draw having a major redesign post Covid, in addition to 4 updates after that draw was built out.

We dealt with the challenges best we could, and all in all, managed to complete the season digitally. Due to the above challenges, unfortunately the Games Played, Goals scored and cards received was not 100% accurate – due to multiple **manual** interventions throughout the season.

I would like to thank all the coordinators for their patience this year, and working with me to help work through match card creation processes as I was trying to resolve various changes and clashed etc.

We are expecting the 2021 season to run very smoothly from the portals' perspective.

During the off-season, I will be working on a number of improvements to the platform, in addition to building more fail-safes (learnings from unforeseen scenarios 2020) to ensure a much smoother transition into the new season.

Some updates schedule between now and start of 2021 season include:

- Automatic season rollover and ladder/stats archive process
- Ability to quickly transfer players from Club A to Club B
- Coordinator emails specifically around when players reach maximum double ups, or where card-points reach 15.
- Improved player statistics
- Implementing photo/avatar for each player (which will display on match card)
- Providing Umpires a method of closing out a match card in scenario's where a coordinator failed to load the card prior to the game close-out process

And no doubt, time permitting, a range of additional updates and improvements – which will continue throughout the 2021 season (including more mobile-friendly screen layouts etc).

Thank you once again to ALL our wonderful team coordinators, and I look forward to working with you all again in 2021.

#### Note 1: Statement of Accounting Policies

This financial report is a special purpose financial report prepared in order to satisfy the financial reporting requirements of the Associations Incorporation Act New South Wales. The committee has determined that the association is not a reporting entity.

The financial report has been prepared on an accruals basis and is based on historic costs and does not take into account changing money values or, except where specifically stated, current valuations of non-current assets.

The following significant accounting policies, which are consistent with the previous period unless otherwise stated, have been adopted in the preparation of this financial report.

#### a) Income Tax

No provision for income tax has been raised as the entity is exempt from income tax under Section 50-45 of the Income Tax Assessment Act 1997.

#### b) Inventories

Inventories are measured at the lower of cost and net realisable value.

#### c) Property, Plant and Equipment (PPE)

Leasehold improvements and office equipment are carried at cost less, where applicable, any accumulated depreciation.

The depreciable amount of all PPE is depreciated over the useful lives of the assets to the association commencing from the time the asset is held ready for use.

Leasehold improvements are amortised over the shorter of either the unexpired period of the lease or the estimated useful lives of the improvements.

#### d) Impairment of Assets

At each reporting date, the entity reviews the carrying values of its tangible and intangible assets to determine whether there is any indication that those assets have been impaired. If such an indication exists, the recoverable amount of the asset, being the higher of the asset's fair value less costs to sell and value in use, is compared to the asset's carrying value. Any excess of the asset's carrying value over its recoverable amount is expensed to the income statement.

#### e) Employee Benefits

Provision is made for the association's liability for employee benefits arising from services rendered by employees to balance date. Employee benefits have been measured at the amounts expected to be paid when the liability is settled.

#### f) Provisions

Provisions are recognised when the association has a legal or constructive obligation, as a result of past events, for which it is probable that an outflow of economic benefits will result and that outflow can be reliably measured. Provisions are measured at the best estimate of the amounts required to settle the obligation at the end of the reporting period.

#### g) Cash and Cash Equivalents

Cash and cash equivalents include cash on hand, deposits held at-call with banks, other short-term highly liquid investments with original maturities of six months or less.

#### 1 Statement of Accounting Policies (continued)

#### h) Revenue and Other Income

Revenue is measured at the fair value of the consideration received or receivable after taking into account any trade discounts and volume rebates allowed. For this purpose, deferred consideration is not discounted to present values when recognising revenue.

Interest revenue is recognised using the effective interest rate method, which for floating rate financial assets is the rate inherent in the instrument. Dividend revenue is recognised when the right to receive a dividend has been established.

Grant and donation income is recognised when the entity obtains control over the funds, which is generally at the time of receipt.

All revenue is stated net of the amount of goods and services tax (GST).

#### i) Leases

Leases of PPE, where substantially all the risks and benefits incidental to the ownership of the asset, but not the legal ownership, are transferred to the association, are classified as finance leases.

Finance leases are capitalised by recording an asset and a liability at the lower of the amounts equal to the fair value of the leased property or the present value of the minimum lease payments. Including any guaranteed residual values. Lease payments are allocated between the reduction of the lease liability and the lease interest expense for that period.

Leased assets are depreciated on a straight-line basis over the shorter of their estimated useful lives or the lease term.

Lease payments for operating leases, where substantially all the risks and benefits remain with the lessor, are charged as expenses in the periods in which they are incurred.

#### j) Goods and Services Tax

Revenues, expenses and assets are recognised net of the amount of GST, except where the amount of GST incurred is not recoverable from the Australian Taxation Office (ATO). Receivables and payables are stated inclusive of the amount of GST receivable or payable. The net amount of GST recoverable from, or payable to, the ATO is included with other receivables or payables in the statement of financial position.

Cash flows are presented in the cash flow statement on a gross basis, except for the GST component of investing and financing activities, which are disclosed as operating cash flows.

#### k) Comparative Figures

When required by Accounting Standards, comparative figures have been adjusted to conform to changes in presentation for the current financial year.
