President's Report

Well, for the first time in 3 years we managed to complete a full season of Masters hockey in 2022 – how good !

Sydney Masters Hockey has continued to grow, develop, and thrive to the level where it continues to be widely acknowledged to be the largest, long standing, best and most successful Masters Hockey Association in NSW, and Australia (both for local competition and representative teams).

This would not have been possible without the fantastic and ongoing dedication, commitment and contributions of the Board, the Club / Team Co-ordinators and all the players and officials, so I wish to extend my sincere appreciation to all participants involved with Sydney Masters Hockey.

In 2022, again there was an increase in players with another 2 additional teams to now total a record 30 teams and more than 530 players from ages 34 through to 81.

The Board was pro-active again this year with the introduction of several new initiatives and the establishment / completion of a number of important projects viz –

- Special subsidy fee assistance was provided this season for team competition fees, representative players and the inaugural Intercity Masters Hockey Challenge.
- Live streaming of 2022 Grand Finals (Premier League and Sydney Cup) was established for the first time. Views of these games highlighted its success (1,374 for Premier League and 1,801 for Sydney Cup).
- A new Representative fixture was added to the calendar with an Intercity Challenge between Sydney and Canberra introduced in December 2021. 4 Sydney teams (Masters, Senior Masters, Grand Masters and Legends) travelled to Canberra to play for the Merv Goodridge and Doug Dawson Cup. Sydney was successful in the inaugural year, and we look forward to Canberra visiting Sydney in November 2022 and this annual challenge continuing for many years to come.
- 20 players represented in Sydney teams for the first time in 2022 at NSW Championships
- The annual General Forum was continued in 2022 (held in July) for Club / Team delegates / representatives to meet with the SMHA Board for major updates and to discuss areas for future improvement for SMHA.
- 2 additional representative teams (another Over 34/40's and an inaugural Over 70's) were established and attended NSW Men's Masters Hockey Championships in 2022 (both were successful in being crowned NSW Champions)
- 7 players were formally recognised as part of the new SMHA Hockey Hero Awards – Congratulations to Mick Harrison, Warren Oldfield, Mike Tuckerman, Ramiro Torres, Glenn Crowhurst, Craig Meller and Craig Springett.

- The Board approved the Naming of 6 currently un-named SMHA Premiership Trophies – Congratulations for the recognition of more than 20 years outstanding service to Sydney Masters Hockey goes to David Webster, Godfrey Phillips, Noel French, David Campbell, Greg Kay and Michael Irby.
- A Review and update of the SMHA Constitution (2016) is underway and will be presented to members in early 2023
- Grand Final formal functions / presentations were re-established in 2022 (with Life Members and Special Guests again invited).
- The “Thank You” dinner function for all Team Co-ordinators was re-introduced and held in December 2021 for the first time in a number of years.

It is also very pleasing to recognise that in 2022 Sydney teams completed their best ever representative season with all teams finishing in the top 4. Four teams finished as NSW Champions in A Division (34/40's, 45's, 50's and 70's), Two finished 2nd, Two finished 3rd and one finished 4th.

Sutherland teams (Sydney South) ensured the best ever results for Sydney based teams in 2022 by winning the Over 60 and 65's A Division titles.

The Representative Report included later in this Annual Report provides more details in relation to the achievements of the teams and players for this year.

I personally want to thank every member of the Board and all members of the Competition and Representative Committees, for their commitment and dedication to always striving to continue to promote and develop Masters Hockey in Sydney to be the best possible experience for all participants.

This provides the opportunity for many players (ie includes those from Central Coast, Newcastle, Wollongong, Southern Highlands, Lithgow, Bathurst, Orange, Macarthur, and Penrith) who choose to participate in the best Men's Masters competitions in Sydney every week during the season.

2022 was a very enjoyable and successful season (after what was 2 challenging years in 2020 and 2021).

Also it is very fitting now for me (on behalf of all members) to formally recognise and express our enormous “Thanks” to Jimmy Fordham as he now leaves the Board after 9 years of outstanding service and commitment to Sydney Masters hockey. His personal expertise and excellent unselfish contribution to the development of the management systems for Sydney Masters Hockey (especially over the past 3-4 years) has been significant and will be a long-standing legacy that he (as we all) can be proud of.

Planning for 2023 has already commenced, so please stay safe and well, enjoy some rest and relaxation with family and friends over the Xmas period.

I look forward to seeing everyone again (and especially all new participants) in early February for a great new season of Masters Hockey in Sydney.

Competitions Report

It was fantastic that 2022 was the first fully completed season (since 2019), however there were still some disruptions at various times due to severe weather conditions, lights failure at the venue, major events at SOP and some continuations of COVID.

Notwithstanding these interruptions, all scheduled matches were completed. The resilience of all players, teams, and officials to get on with the season showed outstanding patience and commitment which was very much appreciated.

In relation to the main season, the number of teams in the Sydney Masters Hockey competitions was increased to 30 (2 more than 2021), across the four Divisions.

The breakdown of the teams and Divisions for 2022 were as follows:

All competitions again ran relatively smoothly for our teams and their players in 2022 with all matches conducted on Monday weekly (February and March only), Tuesday weekly and Wednesday fortnightly at the Sydney Olympic Hockey Centre (the home of Sydney Masters Hockey since 1987). I am sure that all the teams and their players continue to enjoy the opportunity to play regularly at one of the best hockey venues in the world.

Special Thanks to the team from Sydney Olympic Park Sports Centre for their assistance with our playing fields requirements throughout the season.

We would like to pass on our personal thanks to all the Team Coordinators for their great assistance in ensuring that all requests for information etc were quickly acted on. This very much assisted to ensure that communications were effective and that all aspects of the competitions ran as smoothly as possible throughout the season.

Also, we would like to thank again and congratulate the teams for their assistance throughout the season with prompt updates of their team and player information, together with completion of match cards before commencement of matches. This is very important to ensure that all the competition results and ladders were kept up to date on the website at all times. Again, I can report that in 2022, the level of compliance by all teams improved considerably from 2021.

A special thanks to all the Umpires who have made their services available throughout the competition in 2022. Again, this season we were able to welcome some new umpires to the Sydney Masters Hockey competitions and also assist with representative championships. The players continue to appreciate your involvement and patience throughout the season, especially in the understanding of Masters hockey.

The 2022 competition was played in 4 Divisions with all games being played on both fields at Homebush on Tuesday and Wednesday nights.

The overall playing standard in each of the four divisions was again stepped up in 2022, with the majority of all teams in each division being very competitive and capable of defeating all other teams on their night and this is reflected in many of the results throughout the season.

The Pre Season Competition

In 2022, the preseason competition was played in February in five Divisions with 21 teams.

In Premier League there were 3 teams and they competed for the “**Merv Goodridge Cup**”,

The Sydney Cup had 4 teams contesting the “**Tony Cohen Shield**”

For the Masters League there were 6 teams and they contested for the “**Kevin Rix Trophy**”

The Legends and Grand Legends Divisions both had 4 teams in each.

UTS were winners of the “**Merv Goodridge Cup**”

Manly GNS (after a 4-way tie and goal difference count back) was the winner of the “**Tony Cohen Shield**”

Sutherland (after a count back with Sydney Uni) was the winner of the Masters League and the “**Kevin Rix Trophy**”.

Easts were the winner of the Legends Division.

Sydney University was the winner of Grand Legends

New trophies are to be established and suitably named for the Legends and Grand Legends Divisions

Sydney Cup

In the “**Sydney Cup**”, Macquarie University continued on from where they left off in 2021 with an unbeaten run in 2022. Representative Teams Report

Given the 2021 Masters Hockey season in Sydney was cancelled in late June (due to COVID), in October 2021, the Board of Sydney Masters Hockey and the Committee of ACT Masters Hockey, agreed to establish an annual Intercity Masters Hockey Challenge between Canberra Masters and Sydney Masters teams.

The inaugural Challenge was held in Canberra (at the ACT State Hockey Centre) on Sunday 12 December 2021 and involved 4 teams each (Masters Over 40's), Senior Masters (Over 50's), Grand Masters (Over 60's) and Legends (Over 67).

In recognition of two of the foundation members of Sydney Masters Hockey and ACT Masters Hockey, it was agreed that the Intercity Masters Hockey Challenge trophy would be named **The Merv Goodridge and Doug Dawson Cup**.

The overall result was in the balance right up until the last 2 games of the day (it wasn't looking good after 4 matches and Sydney were 1-3 behind).

Thankfully, the Masters and Senior Masters teams reversed earlier losses in the day to record great wins, after the Grand Masters had earlier completed a clean sweep of their 2 matches with impressive victories which meant Sydney were successful in winning the **Merv Goodridge and Doug Dawson Cup** – in the inaugural year 2021.

The full results were –

- Senior Masters – Game 1 (Loss 0-3), Game 2 (Win 1-0)
