President's Report

The 2024 season was very rewarding and delivered outstanding successes.

Sydney Masters Hockey has again elevated its well-deserved reputation as the largest, long standing, best and most successful Masters Hockey Association in NSW (both for local competition and representative teams).

Again this would not have been possible without the fantastic and ongoing dedication, commitment and contributions of the Board, the Club / Team Coordinators and all the players and officials, so I wish to extend my sincere appreciation to all participants involved with Sydney Masters Hockey.

In 2024, we achieved record player numbers (545 from ages 34 through to 83) representing teams who contested competitions from February to September (20 in the preseason competition and 30 in the main season competition).

The Board was pro-active again this year with the introduction of more new initiatives and the establishment / completion of a number of important projects viz –

- Hawkesbury Brewing Company (Mark Berwick) was established as a new major sponsor for 2024.
- New Policies relating to Code of Conduct and Member Protection were developed and implemented for the 2024 season
- Special subsidy assistance was again provided in November 2023 for the Intercity Masters Hockey Challenge against Canberra held in Canberra.
- The special Sydney mid-week only player registration and insurance was continued (accessed by 81 players).
- First Aid Coach continued their support by providing subsidised First Aid accreditation for Sydney Masters hockey players and officials (included new, upgrades and renewals.
- **C Sport** (Luke Domrow) continued with the Live streaming of the 2024 Grand Finals (Premier League, Sydney Cup, Masters and Senior Masters). Views of these games highlighted its success (1,200 for Premier League and Sydney Cup on 24 September, 922 for Masters League and Senior Masters on 25 September).
- The Intercity Challenge (in its 3rd year) between Sydney and Canberra was continued. Sydney travelled to Canberra and 8 matches were conducted at the ACT Hockey Centre in November 2023. Sydney was successful again (all 3 years so far), and the Canberra teams will travel to Sydney in November 2024 for the annual challenge.
- The new Grand Masters Pre Season Premiership Cup was named "The Michael Cooke and Peter Krepp Cup" (all 10 Premiership Cups have now been formally named).
- 2024 Grand Final formal functions / presentations were held (with Life Members and Special Guests again invited).
- "Thank You" dinner function for all Team Co-ordinators was continued and held in October 2024.

 A new Sydney Masters Hockey Corporate Sponsorship strategy was developed and will be implemented for the Pro League series in Sydney in February 2025.

It is also very pleasing to recognise that in 2024 Sydney a record number of teams (12 – 2 more than 2023) again completed a very successful representative season.

Significantly we had 34 players represent Sydney for the first time in 2024.

Overall we had 10 of the teams finishing in the top 4. Four teams finished as NSW Champions (3 in A Division - 34's, 45's, 55's and 1 in B Division – 55's). Four lost in the final and finished 2nd, one finished 3rd, one finished 4th, one finished 5th and one finished 6th.

Sutherland (Sydney South) teams ensured the strong representative results for Sydney based teams in 2024. Sutherland were winners of the Over 60 and Over 65 A Division NSW Championships.

Sydney teams were crowned NSW Champions in 5 of the 8 A Division titles.

The Representative Summary, included later in this Annual Report, provides more details for the 2024 season.

I personally want to thank every member of the Board and all members of the Competition and Representative Committees, for their commitment and dedication to always striving to continue to promote and develop Masters Hockey in Sydney to be the best possible experience for all participants.

Our mid-week competition provides the opportunity for many players who live in surrounding NSW regional towns, outside of Sydney, to travel and participate in the best Men's Masters competitions in Sydney every week during the season.

Congratulations and best of luck to all our Australian representatives who will be competing at the 2024 Masters Hockey World Cups in South Africa (October) and New Zealand (in November).

Overall, 2024 was a very successful and recording breaking season (eclipsing our record year in 2023).

Planning for 2025 has already commenced, so please stay safe and well, enjoy some rest and relaxation with family and friends over the Xmas period.

I look forward to seeing everyone again (and especially all new participants) in February 2025 for the commencement of another great new season of Masters Hockey in Sydney.

I can confidently say that the 2024 season has been a successful year for Sydney Men's Masters Hockey Association.

Overall, I believe that Masters Hockey in Sydney continues to be professionally administered and will continue to be recognised as the premier Masters Hockey Association in NSW.

Finance Report

At the conclusion of the 2024 financial year the finances of the Association continue to be in a strong position, with **net assets of \$86,086.37**

For the year to 30 September 2024, an operating **loss of \$3,970.94** eventuated from total trading activities of \$181,224.71.

The trading result was recorded due "one off" financial / accounting system expenses of \$3,634 that were approved by the Board

Given the above, a negative variance of \$4,500 was recorded against a planned budget surplus of \$530.00.

The negative variance (accounting for the worse than planned operating result in order to tidy up the accounts from previous years) was due mainly to write off of old assets \$3,634 (rep team uniforms) and some carry forward adjustments in MYOB, as per Auditors comments in 2023

Competitions Report

2024 was a highly successful year in what was an expanded season.

We experienced some inconveniences due the 2024 Australian Masters Hockey Championships being held in Sydney (women in June) and men in Hobart (in July). This was due to the 2024 Masters Hockey World Cups being held in October and November — September to October is the normal timing for the National Championships.

Notwithstanding this interruption (limited matches were played during June and July), all the 240 scheduled matches (included finals) were completed. Again, the understanding of all players, teams, and officials to get on with the season was very much appreciated.

In relation to the main season, the structure of the competition was maintained with 5 Divisions (Premier League, Sydney Cup, Masters, Senior Masters and Grand Masters) to cater for the 30 teams.

The breakdown of the teams and Divisions for 2024 were as follows:

The overall playing standard in each of the five divisions was again stepped up in 2024, with the majority of all teams in each division being very competitive and capable of defeating all other teams on their night and this is reflected in many of the results throughout the season.

All competitions again ran relatively smoothly for our teams and their players in 2024 with all matches conducted on Monday weekly (February and March only), Tuesday weekly and Wednesday fortnightly at the Sydney Olympic Hockey Centre (the home of Sydney Masters Hockey since 1987). I am sure that all the teams and their players continue to enjoy the opportunity to play regularly at one of the best hockey venues in the world.

Special Thanks to the team from Sydney Olympic Park Sports Centre for their assistance with our playing fields requirements throughout the season.

We would like to pass on our personal thanks to all the Team Coordinators for their great assistance in ensuring that all requests for information etc were quickly acted on. This very much assisted to ensure that communications were effective and that all aspects of the competitions ran as smoothly as possible throughout the season.

Also, we would like to thank again and congratulate the teams for their assistance throughout the season with prompt updates of their team and player information, together with completion of match cards before commencement of matches. This is very important to ensure that all the competition results and ladders were kept up to date on the website at all times. Again, I can report that in 2024, the level of compliance by all teams was maintained at the high levels from recent years.

A special thanks to all the Umpires who have made their services available throughout the competition in 2024. Again, this season we were able to welcome some new non playing umpires to the Sydney Masters Hockey competitions and also assist with representative championships. The players continue to appreciate your involvement and patience throughout the season, especially in the understanding of Masters hockey.


